

IDEAS PROGRAM

A program of the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, USA Study Abroad branch

Seeking to expand higher education institutions' capacity to expand and broaden study abroad programs for U.S. students

- Expanding study abroad to be more accessible for all students, including student groups that are currently underrepresented in study abroad
- Expanding study abroad at institutions traditionally underrepresented in study abroad
- Expanding study abroad safely to new overseas destinations, especially those that are less common destinations

2025 Grant Competition

- Approximately 35 grants of up to \$35,000
- Approximately 1 IDEAS consortium grant of up to \$50,000



COMPETITION OVERVIEW





ELIGIBILITY

Accredited U.S. institutions of higher education physically based in the United States or its territories

Must support primarily U.S. undergraduate student mobility

Funding may not be used to support direct student costs

Scholarships, travel, passports, tuition, meals, etc.

Funds may be used to support U.S. or foreign faculty and/or staff travel

Institutions may submit more than one proposal; individual units within an institution may submit only one application each

Development of *in-person* programming in foreign locations with a travel advisory level of 1, 2, or 3*

Virtual programming is permitted in all foreign locations

Level 4 locations not permitted

*Level 3 with a safety and security plan



PROJECT PROPOSAL IDEAS

Create a faculty-led study abroad program or internship/experiential learning program(s)

Expand study abroad offerings to a **new location** for the institution, especially a less-common destination

Develop study abroad resources, programs, or materials

Form or further develop partnerships with universities

Support the development of a new study abroad position or office

Develop hybrid or virtual exchange models and programs that complement in-person exchange programs and campus internationalization goals

Embed global, international, or intercultural exchange elements into courses to internationalize curricula

Work with a new or established consortium of colleges and/or universities to address areas of mutual need


Hybrid faculty-led course to France using virtual reality technology

PHASE 1 SELECTION PROCESS

- Eligible and complete applications will be scored by peer reviewers
- Final approval of semifinalists given by the U.S. Department of State

Scoring	50 points total	
Institutional Description/ Statement of Need	10 points	
Proposed IDEAS Project	20 points	
Foreign Policy Goal Alignment	10 points	
Budget Estimate + Summary	10 points	



BEST PRACTICES & TIPS

Be sure to read the entire Request for Proposals

Foreign Policy Goal alignment is key!

Consider collaboration with other offices and partners on- or off-campus

Check in with your Sponsored Programs Office

Use the Application Template to draft your proposal


