IDEAS PROGRAM

A program of the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, USA Study Abroad branch

Seeking to expand higher education institutions' capacity to expand and broaden study abroad programs for U.S. students

- Expanding study abroad to be more accessible for all students, including student groups that are currently underrepresented in study abroad
- Expanding study abroad at institutions traditionally underrepresented in study abroad
- Expanding study abroad safely to new overseas destinations, especially those that are less common destinations

2025 Grant Competition

- Approximately 35 grants of up to \$35,000
- Approximately 1 IDEAS consortium grant of up to \$50,000




Mission:





- University of Southern California Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism is developing a dual language, semester-length, hybrid study abroad program that will train students in international journalism in Mexico.



- North Dakota State University is establishing a network of sport-fordevelopment organizations in South Africa and Tanzania to facilitate internship placements focused on women's empowerment, social cohesion, and global health.





GLOBAL HEALTH


- Example themes:

 - Public health policy and management
- Hollins University is creating study abroad programs in Kenya that will examine comparative health systems between the United States and Kenya and enhance students' knowledge of women's health advocacy.





ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

 - Closing skills gaps in local communities
 - Human resources

- College of Southern Nevada is training a cohort of community college faculty to develop in-person and virtual study abroad experience to increase the number of students at two-year institutions that engage in international and intercultural learning.





TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION

 - Cybersecurity
 - Critical and emerging technologies
 - Digital engagement and policies
 - Engineering
 - Technology cooperation
- Bellevue College will expand students' access to study abroad by creating a faculty-led, hybrid study abroad program in France. The course will provide a framework for understanding how extended reality technologies can be a vehicle for storytelling and how digital media shapes narratives and the public's understanding of war.
